As that work continues throughout this season, we're looking forward to your input and collaboration as we continue to grow some of the most ambitious, compelling, and competitive leagues in football.

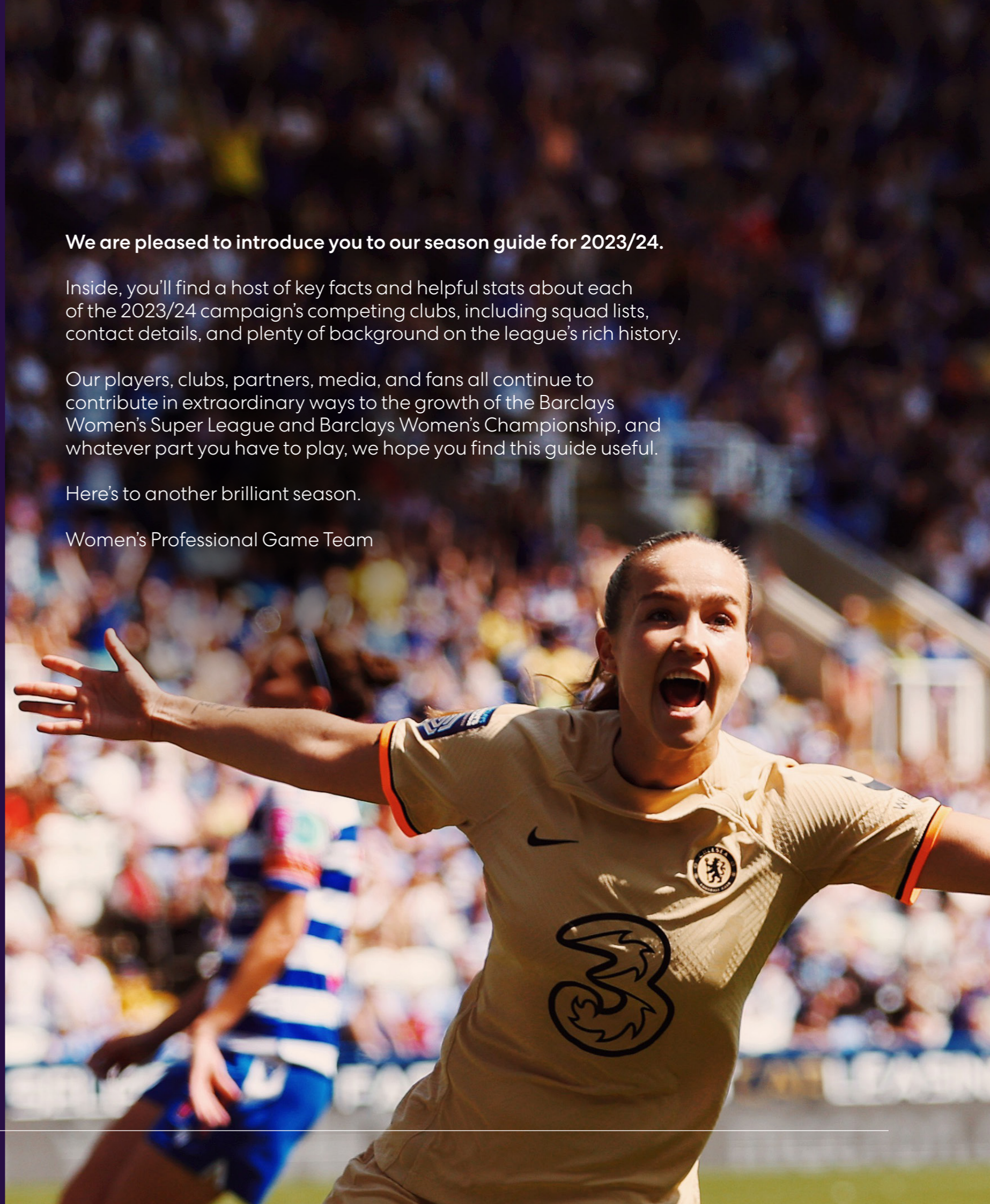
We are pleased to introduce you to our season guide for 2023/24.

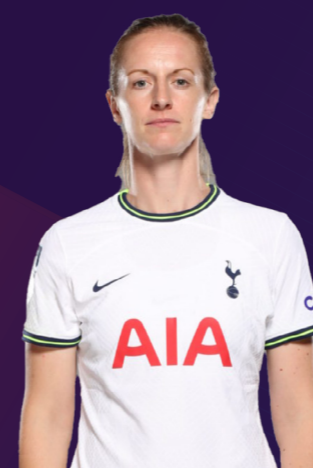

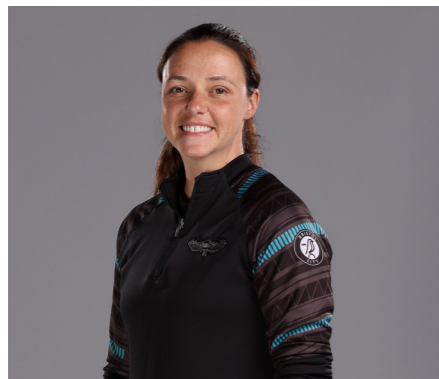

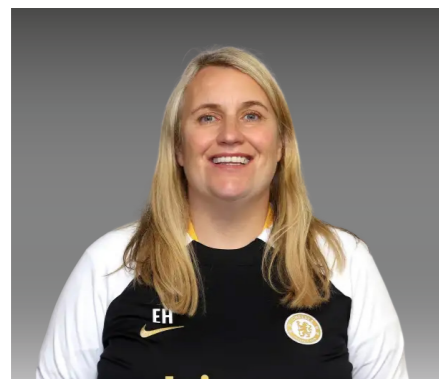

Prenton Park

Liverpool will continue to play their home matches at Prenton Park throughout the 2023/24 season. The Merseyside derby in October will once again return to Anfield where more than 27,000 supporters watched last year's Barclays WSL fixture against Everton.

Liverpool enjoyed their biggest crowd so far at Prenton Park on the last game of last season on May 27 when 5,778 watched the clash with Manchester United.
